Our patients continue to medicate and self-medicate with a variety of prescription and non-prescription products, unaware of potentially serious dental and systemic drug interactions, contraindications, and adverse effects. Armed with limited information and faced with rising medication costs, patients frequently share prescription medications and add or substitute non-prescription products, often without mention during a review of their medical history.

This course is designed to provide dental professionals with an overview of the oral and systemic health effects of the most frequently used prescription drugs, non-prescription drugs, herbal supplements and nutraceuticals as well as techniques for successfully obtaining an accurate patient medication history.

In order to effectively and safely plan and render dental therapy, each member of the dental team must recognize and understand the possible abuse of both licit and illicit substances by their patients.

This course is designed to provide dental professionals with an overview of the most common substances of abuse and their oral manifestations, as well as techniques that may assist in identifying and managing a substance-abusing patient. The potential for contraindications to dental therapy along with possible resulting medical emergencies and the necessity for dosage modifications of commonly used dental medications in such patients will be discussed.
